




She also is a visiting faculty with ISTITUTO MARANGONI, an Italian School for Fashion and Interior Design in Worli, Mumbai since 2018.



DESIGN AS A CATALYST FOR SOCIAL CHANGE

In recent years, Infrastructure growth is growing more visible throughout India in the form of new highways, roads, ports, railways and airports, power plants, urban and rural infrastructure, including water supply, sewerage, and drainage, irrigation and agriculture systems. However, the condition of the infrastructure still remains a matter of concern, especially the Public toilets. <u>The toilets are not gender sensitive in the design leading to many social issues is</u> what are the findings of the <u>Research</u> on <u>Pune Smart City</u>. These toilets are not just potential breeding grounds for bacteria and other infectious diseases, but they also become potential spots for vandalism and other anti-social activities. They are very unsafe for women using these toilets as a basic daily need. Another problem with public toilets is good and regular maintenance of them. With the COVID-19 pandemic, now more than ever, there's a need for public sanitation and hygiene.

COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS

Conscious and sensitive design of Gender-Sensitive public toilets, especially the women ; through practical and wellthought out layouts offering privacy , safety and security to women , use of appropriate materials, well-designed movements patterns, suitable treatment and disposal of sewage, all of this in response to the site conditions are important criteria of design.

Students may choose any existing site conditions for their design and depict it through drawings and photographs. They may also think of refurbishing the existing toilet or demolishing one and reconstructing another in the same location. Students can also suggest strategies for regular maintenance and upkeep of the Public Toilets.

Char dewwar is term used to define a place surround with a wall in order to fortify. The idea of char dewwar is to create environment for women which is secure , safe .the design psychologically and physically uses the idea of wall to infuse the community with the four most walls constructs of a slum community which are good Sanitation , Recreation, Clean and Hygienic walls only erected to dissolve .wall that serve not as obstructions but women to protect from various disease and more secure routine.

Culture is often seen as a road block in design ,something to work around ,when it could be worked with ,bringing about a behaviour change risks potential abdorrment of the structure as a whole .the concept was to introduce elements into their existing environment provide a immensive experience ,they prefer while filtering out the hazards of hygiene and safety associated with it .the idea was to design a respectful responsive and familiar environment to provide them the freedom of choice to various degree of privacy while keeping intact their interest.

However, due to the single function of traditional public toilets and the negative space, the communication in toilets is often just a simple greeting.

As a new form of public space, the location advantage of the project makes them more frequently used and would become a tiny landmark for people gathering. By carefully arrangement of the Interior design also provides more opportunities for people to communicate and stay.








About the community case study:


Why?





Female-friendly public and community toilets must :

- Be safe and private: be in a safe location; have a clearlymarked female toilet section with a separate entrance; have good lighting; have trained male and female attendants; have robust, private cubicles.
- Cater for menstrual and other hygiene requirements by providing: water and soap; hooks, shelves and mirrors; access to menstrual products; means for washing and/or disposal of menstrual products.
- Be accessible to all users: be at a reasonable distance from homes or activity centres; be reachable via an accessible path; have at least one cubicle accessible to all users.
- Be affordable and available when needed; have enough cubicles to avoid long queues, which means allocating extra space and cubicles for women; be open when needed; have an affordable tariff or be free.
- Be well maintained and managed: have adequate management arrangements and cleaning and maintenance budgets; have safe management of faecal, liquid and solid waste.
- Meet the requirements of caregivers and parents: have a baby changing station; have a family-friendly cubicle.




