## BNCA | 7.1.1. Report on Gender Equity & Sensitization in curricular and noncurricular activities

Being an all-women college of architecture, Dr. Bhanuben Nanavati College of Architecture (BNCA), plays a pivotal role in fostering gender equality, empowerment, and leadership within the field of architecture, a traditionally male-dominated discipline. The institution has embraced a strong commitment to creating a supportive and inclusive environment where women can thrive academically, professionally, and personally. As part of this commitment and to create awareness and promote gender equality, the college organizes regular workshops and seminars on topics related to gender inclusivity, equal opportunities, and breaking barriers in the professional world.

The gender audit focuses on gender representation, pay equity, career advancement opportunities, work culture, and policies related to gender equality. The audit reveals that women make up 60% of the total workforce

teaching departments are predominantly held by women.

The institute has a zero-tolerance policy for harassment, and there have been zero reported cases of gender-based discrimination.

#### **Annual Gender Sensitization Plan**

At BNCA, universal human values of equality, inclusion, respect for human dignity, fairness and justice for all are fostered in not just students but faculty and staff too. Through its proactive faculty, staff and student programs, BNCA will annually look into the following:

- Promoting communication with respect for human dignity and social responsibility.
- Allow the recognition of multidimensional representations of women and men.
- Promote communications that represent unbiased representations of gender equity.
- Conduct workshops and orientation programs that promote diversity and gender-sensitive communication and behavior for students and staff.
- To provide Counselling facility where faculty and students can reach out in matters of need related to gender-related communication. To conduct counselling sessions for the girl students on a regular manner by the lady faculty members.
- In classes, faculty members promoting leadership and participation of girl students for roles which generally are taken by males.
- Balanced gender quota in hiring admin staff and faculty.
- To ensure equal rights and participations in regular cultural activities, sports, NCC, debate, celebrations, and performing arts. Girl students are to be encouraged by all means without any sign of gender discrimination.



- Lady faculties and staff members are to be given equal participations in different activities performed throughout the year. All the committees formed, should include lady faculties and staffs in appropriate numbers.
- To conduct awareness programme for safety and security on regular basis.
- Sensitisation by the elements of education in the curriculum to be strictly monitored.
   Different activities and topics related to gender sensitization to be integrated into the curriculum.
- To conduct classes, competitions and studio assignments related to gender, women's rights and women empowerment for students by the departmental faculty members and NSS.
- Series of training programmes on Woman Entrepreneurship Development.
- Awareness Programme on 'Nutrition and Food Habits' for Women staff and girl students.
- Organisation of inspirational lectures and talks by successful women leaders, practitioners to motivate girl students for future career and societal roles.

- Breaking Stereotypes in Architecture: Addressing the challenges women face in the male-dominated world of architecture, and how to overcome bias and stereotypes.

- Empowering women students to pursue leadership roles in architecture and beyond is central to the college's mission. The college runs a variety of empowerment programs, including:

- Skill-building Workshops: These focus on personal development, including public speaking, confidence-building, and entrepreneurship, preparing students to excel in male-dominated sectors.
- Networking Events/ Alumni interactions: Regular networking sessions with women architects and designers help students connect with industry leaders, build professional networks, and discover new career opportunities.







She also is a visiting faculty with ISTITUTO MARANGONI, an Italian School for Fashion and Interior Design in Worli, Mumbai since 2018.



#### **Counselling Services:**


• The college offers confidential counselling services, providing students with a safe space to address personal and academic challenges.

#### 7.1.3.: Green Campus Initiatives

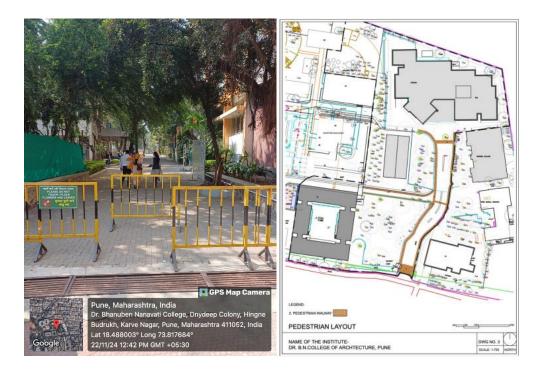

From tree plantation drives to waste management programs, these efforts improve the campus environment and help instill a sense of responsibility among students, staff, and the community. Through these activities, the college aims to serve as a model for sustainable practices, inspiring stakeholders to adopt eco-conscious habits in their daily lives. BNCA's Environmental Department and Landscape Department regularly organize many activities and events on the campus to ensure the maintenance of a clean and green campus. Treeplantation drives are undertaken each year to increase the green coverage on the campus. A QR code was implemented on campus to promote awareness of the importance of trees in urban ecology and biodiversity in an educational campus. BNCA organizes various awareness drives about energy and water conservation, plastic pollution, climate change, global warming, climate resilience, and carbon footprint. A 'Sustainable Development Goal' hub was established in BNCA to give our contribution to the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) set by the UN. 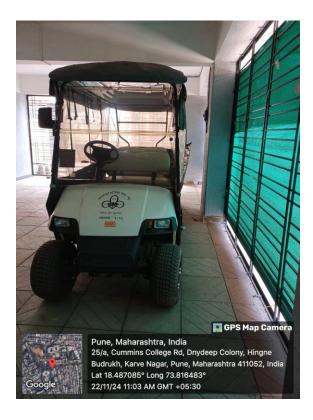

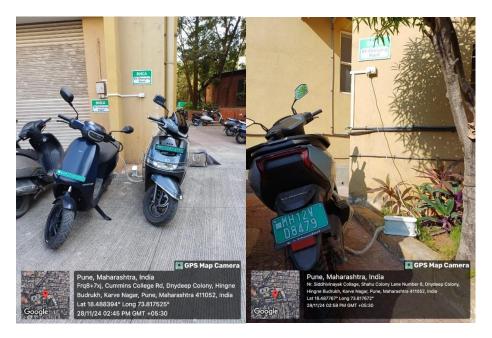


Vehicle free safe pedestrian pathways.

• An Electric cart is used regularly for campus transportation.





• BNCA has provided 4 charging points for electric vehicle charging for staff and students to encourage using EV for commuting to college.

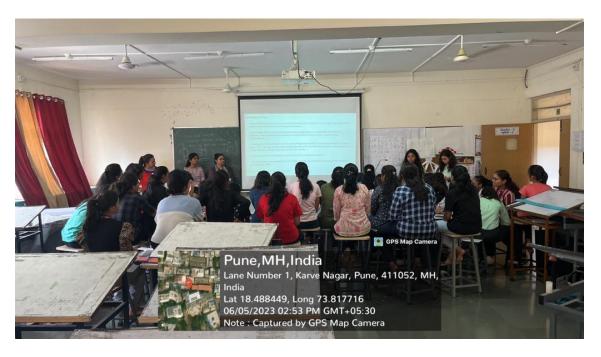






#### • Environment awareness drive












#### i. Awards and Competitions
