The institution has embraced a strong commitment to creating a supportive and inclusive environment where women can thrive academically, professionally, and personally. As part of this commitment and to create awareness and promote gender equality, the college organizes regular workshops and seminars on topics related to gender inclusivity, equal opportunities, and breaking barriers in the professional world.

The gender audit focuses on gender representation, pay equity, career advancement opportunities, work culture, and policies related to gender equality. The audit reveals that women make up 60% of the total workforce

Girl students are to be encouraged by all means without any sign of gender discrimination.

- Sensitisation by the elements of education in the curriculum to be strictly monitored. Different activities and topics related to gender sensitization to be integrated into the curriculum.

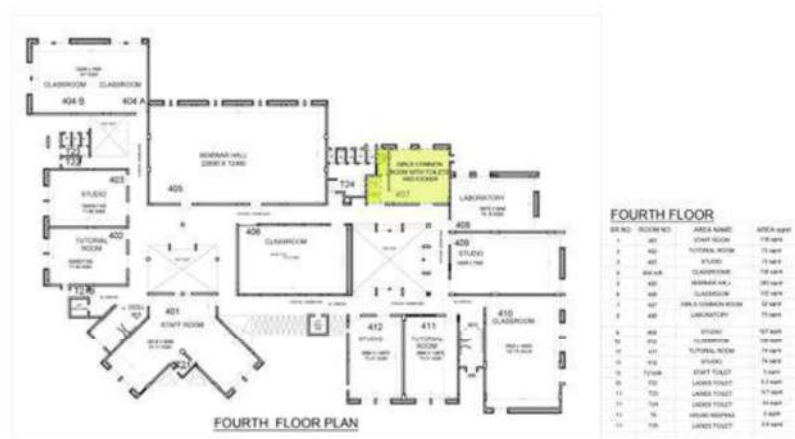
- The college offers confidential counselling services, providing students with a safe space to address personal and academic challenges.

- The girls' toilets have sanitary napkin dispensers and necessary hygiene products stocked in the toilets.

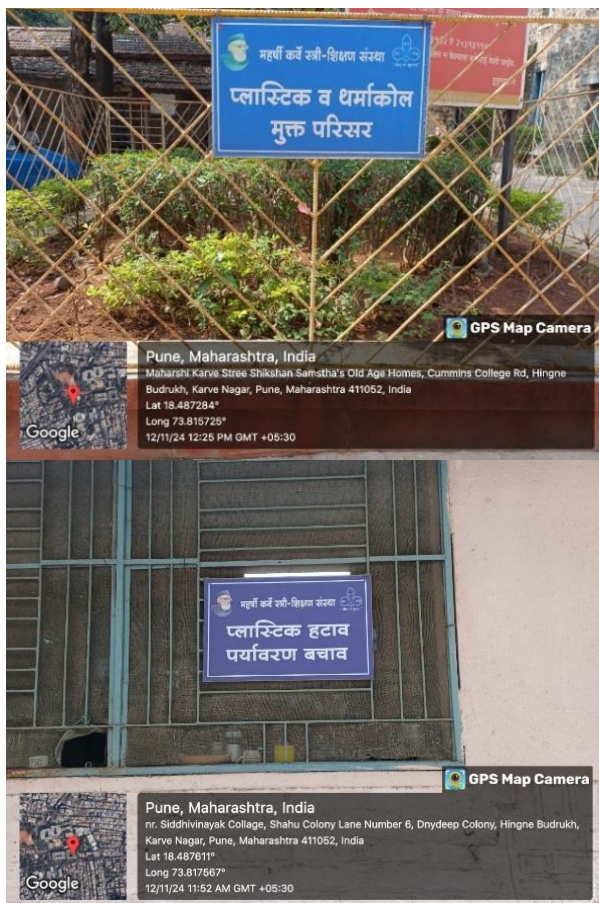


Common room/ sick room for students to relax and recuperate.

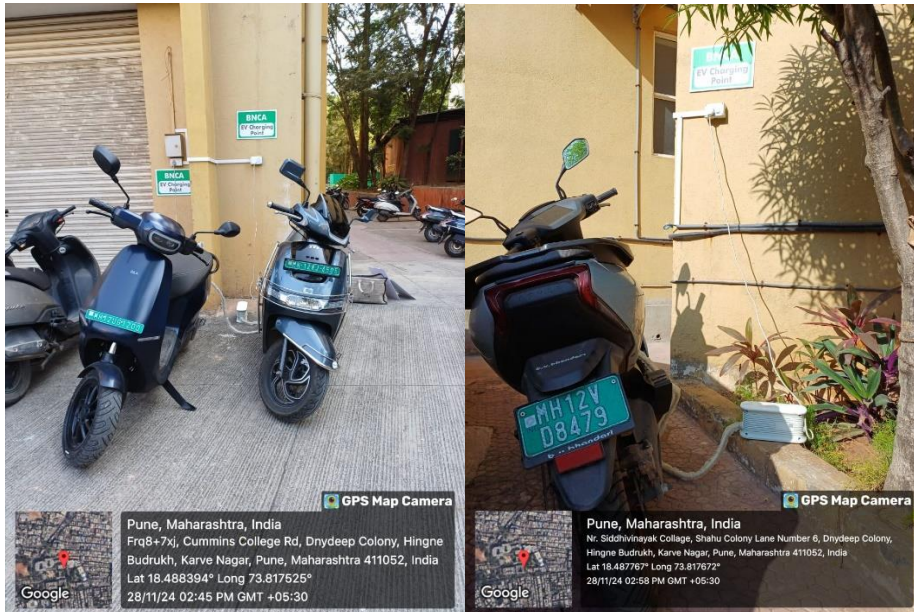

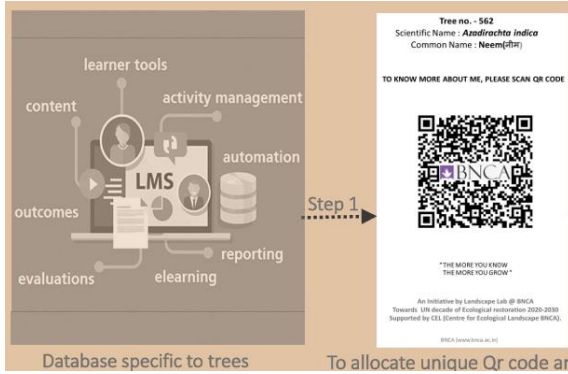

The mango tree is erect, 30 to 100 ft high, with a broad, rounded canopy which may, with age, attain 100 to 125 ft in width, or a more upright, oval, relatively slender crown. In deep soil, the taproot descends to a depth of 20 ft, the profuse, wide-spreading, feeder root system also sends down many anchor roots which penetrate for several feet. The tree is long-lived, some specimens being known to be 300 years old and still fruiting. Nearly evergreen, alternate leaves are borne mainly in rosettes at the tips of the branches and numerous twigs from which they droop like ribbons on slender petioles 1 to 4 in long. Hundreds and even as many as 3,000 to 4,000 small, yellowish or reddish flowers, 25% to 98% male, the rest hermaphroditic, are borne in profuse, showy, erect, pyramidal, branched clusters 2 1/2 to 15 1/2 in high. There is great variation in the form, size, color and quality of the fruits. They may be nearly round, oval, ovoid-oblong, or somewhat kidney-shaped, often with a break at the apex, and are usually more or less lop-sided.

Uses: It is evergreen Shade giving tree, many times used in boundary plantation, used as Specimen tree, in sitting places to create natural shade It cultivates for its sweet fleshy fruit so, plays important role in economy for farmers.

Medicinal Uses: Mango plants produce fleshy stone fruits rich in phytochemicals with an undisputed nutritional value for its high content of polyphenolics and vitamins. This review provides an overview of the antioxidant, anti-inflammatory, and anticancer properties of mango, a fruit that should be included in everyone's diet for its multifaceted biochemical actions and health-enhancing properties.

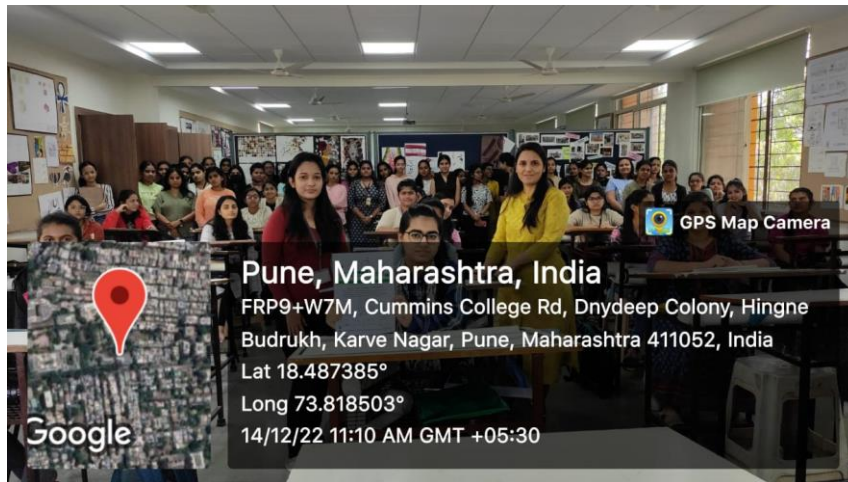
- 'Wood waste workshop'

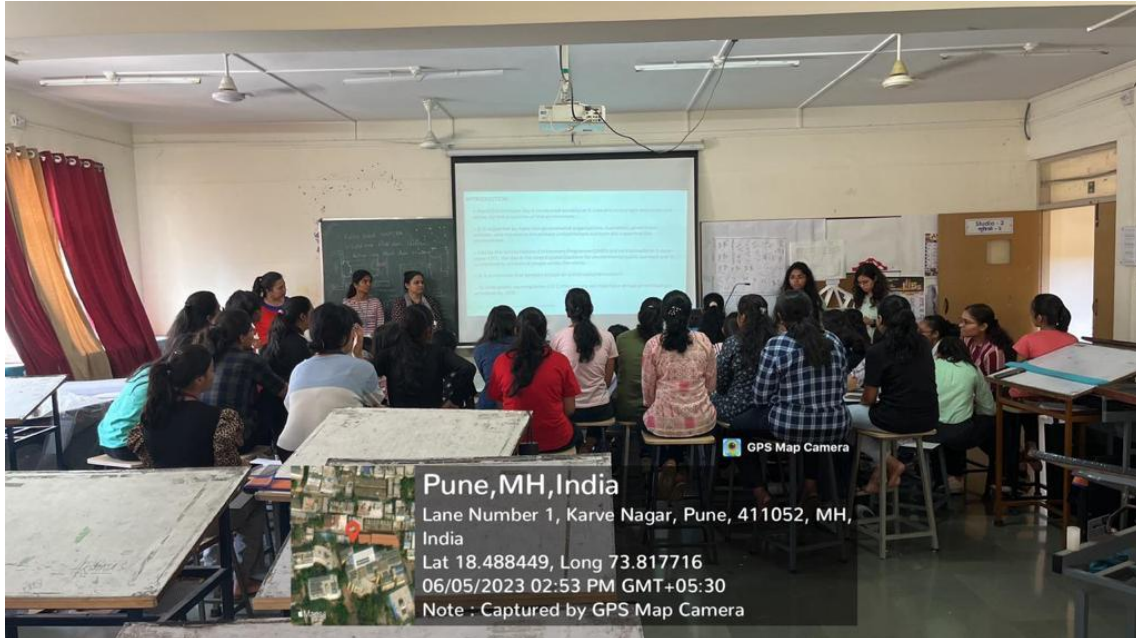
- **Workshop - 'Know your Carbon Footprint'**



BNCA had invited a speaker named Prachi Shevgaonkar, who is a communicator, climate entrepreneur, and the founder of an award-winning startup 'Cool The Globe' - an app that enables common people to reduce their greenhouse gas emissions. It has over 10,000 users with a presence in 55 countries across the world and is burgeoning into a citizen-led movement for climate action.

Prachi spent months covering stories of youth, farmers, waste picker communities, and citizen groups to understand the impact of climate change on the day-to-day lives of people. She firmly believes that when ordinary citizens come together, miracles can happen. The ethos behind the app is to make climate action achievable, simple, and quantifiable, and to empower individuals to take small but consistent measures to contribute to surmounting climate change.

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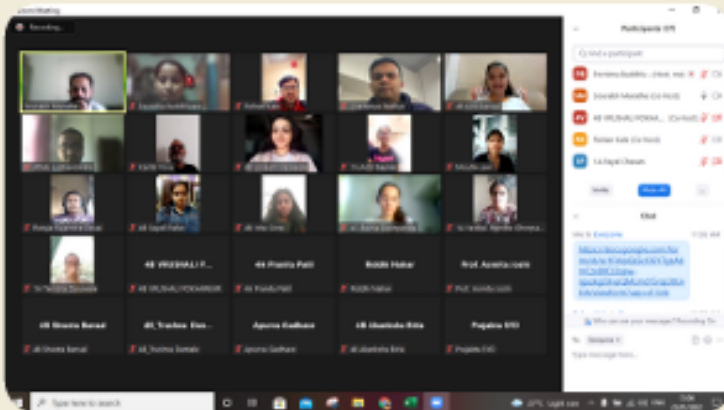

BNCA has various cells like the SDG hub, NSS team, Environmental Department, and Landscape Department that regularly organize activities and awareness drives to promote eco-consciousness and contribute to the community's ecological well-being. Through workshops, seminars, and community interactions, these campaigns aim to educate and inspire individuals about sustainable living practices and environmental conservation. The activities aimed to address pressing environmental issues through practical and impactful measures include the following.

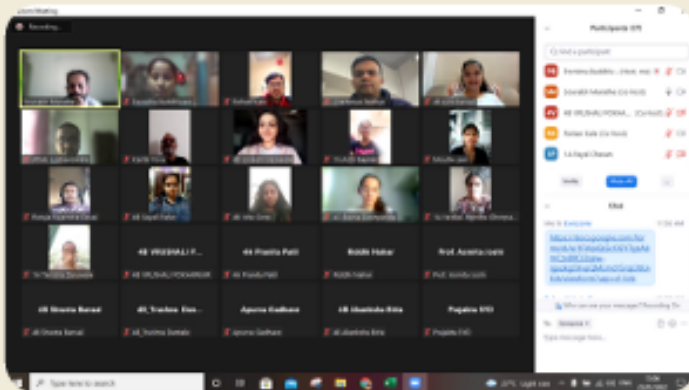

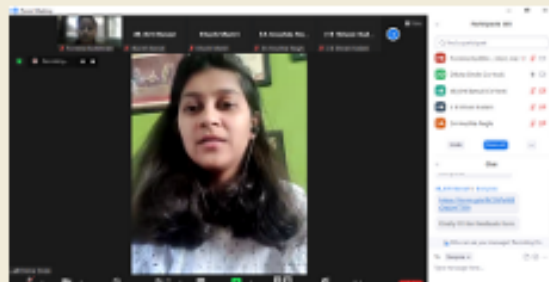

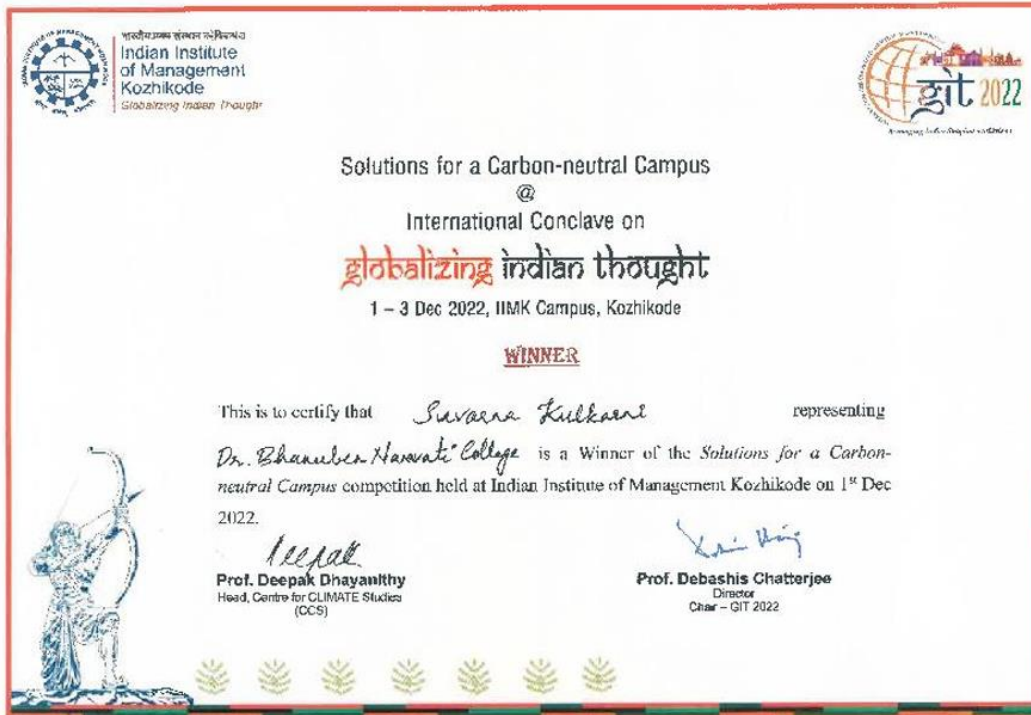
