Summary of the event (150-200 words):

The Online International Collaborative Studio 2022-23 was conducted in the month of September 2022

between Bhanubhen Nanavati College of Architecture, Polytechnic University of Philippines and Manipal Academy of Higher Education, Dubai, for 3rd Year and 4th Year Architecture students from the respective universities.

Aim of the Studio

To understand how migration has affected the image of the city. We use Kevin Lynch Theory to document the image of the city by doing field survey. The studio focussed on mapping a particular district of the city:-India:- Pune Hadapsar Area – Dubai:- Bur Dubai, Deira and Satwa. Philippines:- Baseco Compound, Manila

Image of the city: Kevin Lynch

Kevin Lynch formulated a new criterion — imageability — and shows its potential value as a guide for the building and rebuilding of cities. He defines cities as temporal art and studies the associations of the citizens with it in the following mentioned aspects: -

- Path: primary data collection photographs, maps etc.
- Node: primary data collection photographs, maps etc.
- Landmark: through semi-structured interviews, secondary data analysis and literature review

• Edge: primary data collection photographs, maps, literature content analysis, development control rules

• District: development control rules, plans, land-use, and maps

All these aspects together create the Image of the City and helps us in understanding the Legibility of the cityscape, which might give us insights into how the city is been perceived by its inhabitants. This informs us regarding how the migration patterns affect various aspects of urban morphology with respect to employment opportunities creating growth in commercial centers and educational institutions. The migration also affects the living standards seeking rise in the real estate investments and the housing sector overall, which further followed by the infrastructural growth.





MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ON ACADEMIC EXCHANGES BETWEEN DR. BHANUBEN NANAVATI COLLEGE OF ARCHITECTURE AND POLYTECHNIC UNIVERSITY OF THE PHILIPPINES

PREAMBLE

MKSSS's Dr. Bhanuben Nanavati College of Architecture for Women ("BNCA") affiliated with Savitribai Phule Pune University, with an office at Maharshi Karve Stree Shikshan Samstha's BNCA Campus, Karve Nagar, Pune – 411052, India, and Polytechnic University of the Philippines ("PUP"), with principal address at Anonas St., Sta Mesa, Manila, Philippines, recognizing the value of international cooperation seek to expand scholarly ties, facilitate academic cooperation, and promote mutual understanding. Through this Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU"), both BNCA and PUP agree to explore an academic and scientific collaboration based on the principles of mutual equality and reciprocity of benefits. BNCA and PUP are also hereinafter referred to singly as university or party and collectively as universities or parties.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

MKSSS's BNCA, founded in 1994 under the leadership of Mr. Avinash Wardekar and Principal Dr. Anurag Kashyap, with the generous donation of Rs. 90 lakhs given by the late Mr. Mahendrabhai Nanavati, has a glorious historical background of Maharshi Karve Stree Shikshan Samstha, Pune (MKSSS), founded in 1896, with the main mission of uplifting the social, educational, financial, and spiritual condition of women and widows, making them confident and self-reliant. The institute is conceived as a multidisciplinary center for learning where architectural education is considered a total personality development program. BNCA offers the following programs: Bachelor of Architecture (B Arch), Master of Architecture (M Arch), and Doctorate programs (PhD) under Savitribai Phule Pune University, and there are around 1100 students receiving education from BNCA every year. It evolved, in essence, to ensure quality education, and it has maintained this agenda to the present day. This institute has been established with a futuristic approach and idealism toward architectural education. BNCA is affiliated with Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune, India (Affiliation No: PU/PN/ARCH/109/94) and approved by the All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE) and the Council of Architecture, New Delhi, India.

PUP, founded in 1904 and started as the Manila Business School, is one of the most highly competent educational institutions in the Philippines. The institution has more than 20 campuses nationwide, serving more than 70,000 students, and offers a wide range of courses, including bachelor's degrees, doctorates, and master's degrees, as well as technology courses through traditional and distance learning. PUP is committed to promoting nation-building and alleviating poverty for the marginalized sector of society with quality, responsive, and relevant education as a tool.

1. **DEFINITIONS**

1.1 "Home University" means the university that is sending staff or students to the Host University.

1.2 "Host University" means the university that accepts staff or students from the Home University.

1.3 **"Inviting University**" means the university that's requesting the staff or student to participate in a cultural exchange program.

2. STAFF EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

2.1 Reciprocal Exchange of Academic Staff/Staff Program

The two universities may nominate their academic staff to participate in an exchange for the purpose of studying or lecturing at the other university on a reciprocal basis. The visiting academic staff participant (each, an "Exchange Visitor") shall be subject to all applicable laws of the host country, including but not limited to immigration laws, and subject to approval by the Host University. The period of exchange will be mutually determined by the Parties. For academic exchanges, it is anticipated that the Home University will maintain its Exchange Visitor on a full salary during the period of the exchange. It is not anticipated that the Host University will have any financial obligations to support the Exchange Visitor; however, the Host University will provide a university appointment, if appropriate; office space; library and research facilities; and, as far as possible, other assistance. The Host University will also assist the Exchange Visitor in locating living accommodations and in matters of health, language, and local custom.

2.2 Visiting Academic Staff/Cultural Exchange Program

In addition to the reciprocal exchanges, either university may invite faculty members of the other university for the purpose of participating in conferences, attending symposia, lecturing, or consulting for a specified period of time, subject to the approval of the Home University. In such cases, the Inviting University and Home University will mutually determine funding arrangements with the invited faculty member. Each invited faculty member shall be considered an Exchange Visitor.

2.3 Visiting Research Fellows

Either university may nominate one or more of its faculty to visit the other university for the purpose of advanced study or research (each, a "Visiting Research Fellow"), subject to the approval of the Host University. In such cases, the Home University will provide the Visiting Research Fellow with a salary based on the Home University's regulations. Each Visiting Research Fellow shall be considered an Exchange Visitor. It is not anticipated that the Host University will have any financial obligations to support the Exchange Visitor. However, the Host University will provide office space, library and research facilities, and an appointment, if appropriate.

3. STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM

3.1 Exchange of Students

Each university may send students to the other university to participate in academic rotations, subject to the availability of the Host University. In such cases, students will submit an application and fulfill all participation requirements of the Host University. The parties will mutually determine the period of exchange. Each student shall be considered an Exchange Visitor.

3.2 Degree Programs

Both universities agree that the exchange program for degree training should follow the educational system and regulations of the Home University.

4. JOINT RESEARCH + EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

4.1 **Opportunities**

The universities will seek opportunities to cooperate in research and/or educational projects.

4.2 Research Proposals

The details of specific research or educational (such as Joint Studio experience, Joint Workshops, etc.) proposals will be determined by the mutual agreement of the universities. The form of research or educational cooperation may vary with the goal of each research or educational project. The

universities agree that, *prior to the commencement of each research or educational project*, a Program Agreement (defined in Section 5 below) must be entered into between the universities that includes terms specific to the research or educational project consistent with the policies of PUP and BNCA, to cover any event of research or educational collaboration leading to patent rights, copyrights, and other intellectual property rights.

5. PROGRAM AGREEMENTS

5.1 General Terms for Program Agreements

Prior to the initiation of a specific program, the parties shall discuss each specific program activity described in Sections 2, 3, and/or 4 above and agree to the terms related to that specific program in writing in the form of a Program Agreement. Each Program Agreement entered into will form an Appendix and be attached to and incorporated into this MOU. Parties agree that each Program Agreement Appendix shall include terms to address the timing of the program, details deemed relevant to the program, and the applicable terms set forth in Exhibit A, which is attached and incorporated into this MOU. Both universities understand that every Program Agreement will be negotiated and be dependent on the availability of funds.

5.2 Exchange Program Agreement

Prior to the initiation of exchange programs under Sections 2 and/or 3, the parties shall discuss staff exchange and/or student exchange activities and agree to the terms related to the specific program in writing in the form of a Program Agreement.

5.3 Joint Research Program Agreement

Prior to the initiation of programs under Section 4, the parties shall discuss joint research activities and a Program Agreement will be entered into which will include the terms of joint activities, terms to address the timing of the program, conditions for utilizing the results achieved, details deemed relevant to the program and items noted in Section 4.2 above.

6. EXCHANGE OF ACADEMIC MATERIALS

6.1 Materials

Each university shall exchange all relevant materials, such as those relating to the library, on a regular basis. The libraries can also exchange reference materials for research purposes.

6.2 Legal Requirements of Exchange

The exchange of academic materials shall be consistent with applicable legal and contractual requirements applicable to international studies governing universities.

7. COORDINATION OF THE EXCHANGE

7.1 Designation of Liaison Officers

Each university shall designate a Liaison Officer to develop and coordinate the specific activities agreed upon.

7.2 Role of Liaison Officers

Through these Liaison Officers, each party may initiate proposals for activities, and specific details of any such activities will be set forth in a letter of proposal and Program Agreements, as appropriate.

8. TERM, AMENDMENT, RENEWAL AND TERMINATION

8.1 Term

This MOU becomes effective on _____, 2022 and will remain in force for three (3) years.

8.2 Amendment

Both Parties may at any time review this MOU and the actions taken under it. This MOU may be modified or amended only by a written agreement signed by an authorized representative of the parties.

8.3 Renewal

This MOU is automatically renewed every five (5) years for an additional term of five (5) years without change on that date unless one party gives written notice three (3) months in advance of

the renewal date.

8.4 Termination

The MOU may be terminated with three (3) months' advance notice to the other party at any time for any reason by the appropriate authority of either party unless an earlier date is mutually agreed upon.

9. ASSIGNMENT

Neither party may assign this MOU or any right under this MOU without the prior written consent of the other party.

10. NAME AND LOGO

Neither party shall use, or permit others to use, the other party's name, trademark, or logo for any purpose or in any descriptive or promotional literature or communication of any kind without the other's prior written approval. For clarity, PUP may not refer to BNCA, and BNCA may not refer to PUP or this MOU nor use the BNCA/PUP name or logo in any disclosure to its clients, investors, consultants, officers, employees, or suppliers or to any other third party or regulatory body in any publicity or advertising material without first obtaining BNCA's or PUP's *prior written consent*, which, when and if applicable, shall be in accordance with the parameters determined under BNCA's or PUP's applicable related policies, rules and regulations.

11. PUBLICATIONS

Unless otherwise provided in a Program Agreement, Exchange Visitors must obtain prior written approval from the Home University and Host University before publishing any material relating to the exchange experience. Program Agreements may provide that Exchange Visitors shall be able to publish material relating to the exchange in accordance with the Home University's policies, provided, however, that the Exchange Visitor shall give the Host University an advance copy of the proposed publication and allow the Host University at least a sixty-day (60) opportunity to remove any confidential information of the Host University prior to publication.

12. EXCLUSIVITY

The MOU is not intended to conflict with or affect any existing or future affiliation between the parties and institutions not party to this MOU. This MOU is not exclusive.

13. COMPENSATION

This MOU does not contemplate the payment of any fee or remuneration by either party due to the other but is intended to jointly benefit both parties. It is jointly understood and agreed that implementation of exchanges and Program Agreements may reflect tuition and other fees and will be subject to the availability of necessary funding and other resources at the Host University.

14. RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES

Nothing in this MOU gives rise to a relationship of agency between the parties. Each of BNCA and PUP enter into this MOU staying totally and entirely independent from the other. The Parties shall remain independent, and nothing in the present MOU shall be interpreted as creating a business entity/relationship between the Parties or granting a power of attorney from one to the other.

15. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

Each party shall comply with all relevant laws applicable in its jurisdiction, including taxation and privacy laws.

16. LEGAL EFFECT

The terms of this MOU represent the current intentions of the parties as of the time of the last signing. Except for Sections 8, 9, 10, 12, 14, 15, 16, 17, and 19, this MOU is not legally binding on the parties.

17. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

If any misunderstandings arise during the term of this MOU, the parties will seek to resolve the matter through discussion between them. Both Parties agree to try to solve all possible disputes arising under this MOU and any Program Agreements amicably and in the spirit of friendship and good faith. If said dispute is not resolved within thirty (30) days as of serving a notice of dispute

from one Party to the other, then the dispute arising in connection with this MOU or any Program Agreement shall be settled by arbitration as set forth herein. All negotiations connected with the dispute will be conducted in complete confidence and the Parties undertake not to divulge details of such negotiations except to their professional advisers who will also be subject to such confidentiality. Such negotiations shall be without prejudice to the rights of the Parties in any future proceedings. If the Parties otherwise reach an agreement on the resolution of the dispute, such agreement shall be reduced to writing and, once it is signed by their duly authorized representatives, shall be final and binding on the Parties.

18. REPUTATION AND PROFESSIONALISM

Notwithstanding other clauses in this MOU, the parties will use their best endeavors not to carry out any action that is likely to damage the reputation of the other. BNCA and PUP shall, at all times during this MOU, conduct themselves, and procure that their employees, personnel, and consultants conduct themselves, within the highest standards of their profession.

19. CONFIDENTIALITY

"Confidential Information" shall mean any personal data, including data about students and faculty, and material or data or any other information disclosed by a Party to another Party that has been designated in writing as confidential or that ought reasonably to be considered confidential (however it is conveyed or on whatever media it is stored), including information that relates to the business, affairs, properties, assets, trading practices, developments, trade secrets, intellectual property, know-how, customers, agents, and suppliers of a Party. All Confidential Information provided or disclosed by a Party (the "Disclosing Party") to the other Party (the "Receiving Party") under or in connection with this Agreement shall remain the property of the Disclosing Party and shall be treated by the Receiving Party as confidential.

20. NONDISCRIMINATION

PUP and BNCA agree that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, national origin, gender, or creed, be excluded from participation in an exchange program under the terms of this MOU all in accordance with their respective policies and regulations.

21. ENGLISH

This MOU has been made in English in two identical copies for signature by the parties. Notwithstanding any versions of this MOU that may exist in languages other than English, PUP shall be bound only by the provisions of this MOU expressed above in this English version.

IN WITNESS THEREOF, the parties caused this MOU to be executed by their authorized representatives as of the Effective Date.

EXHIBIT A APPENDIX TERMS

The parties agree to include at least the following terms in each Appendix, as applicable:

Selection of Candidates. Each Exchange Visitor must meet the applicable requirements of the Host University. Exchange Visitors selected for the exchange will be required to have sufficient knowledge of the language appropriate to the Host University to carry out their studies and research at the Host University. A Host University may not discriminate against an Exchange Visitor candidate based on the candidate's race, sex, color, religion, or age. Selection in an exchange program does not entitle the Exchange Visitor to pursue a degree at the Host University.

Compliance with Host University Policies. Each Exchange Visitor must comply with applicable policies of the Host University throughout his/her participation in the exchange program.

Visas. Each Exchange Visitor is responsible for obtaining and maintaining any visa needed for participation in the exchange program. The Host University will provide the Exchange Visitor with the documents necessary for obtaining a visa. Each Exchange Visitor must keep the Host University apprised of any changes in his/her visa status.

Health, Accident and Professional Liability Insurance. Each Exchange Visitor must provide evidence of comprehensive medical insurance, accident insurance, and third-party liability coverage prior to admission into the exchange program and is responsible for all costs related to Exchange Visitor's medical care incurred during the exchange program. Exchange Visitors must provide contact information, including a telephone number, for the insurance carrier or provider of insurance.

Expenses. Each Exchange Visitor is responsible for travel (airfare and local transportation), accommodations, and other expenses related to his/her participation in the exchange program, except for invited Exchange Visitors for whom appropriate funding arrangements may have been made upon mutual agreement of the Parties.

Discipline/Removal. Each Host University shall have full responsibility for conducting any Exchange Visitor disciplinary proceedings in accordance with its own rules and regulations. Notwithstanding the above, the Home University agrees to terminate the participation of any Exchange Visitor assigned to the Host University, upon request of the Host University, if the Host University has determined that the Exchange Visitor fails to abide by the practices, rules, policies, or procedures of the Host University or in any way threatens to impair the delivery of educational services to the Host University.

Educational Records. Home University shall maintain all required educational records and reports relating to the participation of each Exchange Visitor (student) assigned at the Host University for a reasonable period, e.g., six (6) years from the date of Exchange Visitor's graduation. In the event of pending litigation involving such records, those records shall be maintained until a resolution of the legal action is reached.

MKSSS's Dr. B.N. College of Architecture for Women, Karve Nagar, Pune 38, India represented in its deed by its Principal Dr.Anurag Kashyap

1. PURPOSE

The present agreement is aimed at the development of academic exchange and teaching cooperation.

2. FORESEEN ACTIVITIES

The present agreement foresees students exchange activities. The duration of the exchanges will be planned by both institutions according to the defined curricula of students taking part in the exchange; the exchange period will last not less than 6 months and no more than one academic vear

3. PERSONS INVOLVED

Every year a maximum of 2 exchange students per Institution will be involved in the exchange (Responsible for PM: Prof. Ingrid Paoletti - Responsible for BNCA: Prof. Shruti Joshi)

Exchanges shall be balanced at School level over the five-year duration of the present agreement.

4. COSTS

Expenses for travel and accommodation will be the responsibility of the student. The host institution will help students in their incoming procedures and in obtaining the same facilities foreseen for their students and/or scholarships.

Before students' departure, the home institution must guarantee that exchange students have purchased the required insurance.

No financial commitment has been entered into either by the home institution, nor by the host institution

Exchange students will pay applicable tuition and fees only to their home institution. No fees will be paid to the host institution for the entire period of the exchange.

5. TUTORING

Each institution will designate a professor responsible for the exchange program.

The designated professor will follow students who take part in the exchange until their departure. He/she will be in contact with them for the entire exchange period; he/she will verify, upon students' return, that the procedures for academic recognition of activities developed at the partner institution have a successful conclusion.

The designated professor will help students coming from participating institutions in setting them up in his/her institution. He/she will periodically supervise the progress in the study programme during the exchange period. He/she will verify that offices in charge of students' mobility at his/her institution will provide to fill out, in the right way, the necessary documents for the recognition by the home institution of the activities developed during the exchange period.

6. STUDY PROGRAMME AND ACADEMIC RECOGNITION

Curricula of students who take part in exchange activities will be agreed upon before students' departure and they will be approved by the competent academic bodies.

The full recognition of activities developed during the exchange period will be guaranteed; transfer of academic credits will be decided by both parties and will be determined by the competent academic bodies.

7. ECTS SCALES

Where possible, the two parties will produce the transcripts of records of the exchange students reporting also the marks according to the ECTS scales.

Where not possible, they will provide information on the distribution curve of marks.

Moreover, where an entrance selection is practiced, the success percentage will be given.

8. SAFETY, PREVENTION

Each institution shall maintain policies of insurance, indemnity and safety for staff and students within the law of its own country.

9. DURATION

This agreement will be effective from the date on which it has been duly signed by both parties and will have a term of five years. This agreement can be renewed by mutual written consent of the parties after verification of the activities developed during its duration.

10. AMENDMENTS

This agreement may be amended by the mutual consent of the parties hereto.

11. WITHDRAWAL

Any party may withdraw from this agreement at any time, and the agreement will terminate one hundred eighty days after the date of the written communication of the withdrawal to the partner institution. All activities in effect at the time of such notice shall be permitted to be completed in the same manner as if no such notice was given.

12. CONTROVERSY

The parties agree to solve in a friendly manner any controversy rising from the interpretation of the present agreement.

In the event that the disagreement cannot be resolved, the issue(s) will be submitted for arbitration; each party will appoint a member of the arbitration panel, and one member will be chosen by mutual consent.
